RE: Fencing.

Dear Mr. Zisk:

The Public Works Department has no objections to you placing fencing on your property adjacent to Dry Creek. This is based on premise that the type of fencing you intend will not unduly impede the flow of flood waters. Solid board fencing or cyclone fencing immediately adjacent to the main channel would probably unduly restrict flood waters. However, during our phone conversation, it was my understanding that you intend to place a barbwire type of fence in order to discourage trespassers and control livestock within your property boundaries. As far as I know, there is no reason for you to obtain any type of permit under the existing city codes for this type of construction, as long as it is not over six feet high or within 20 feet of the public street frontage or unduly restrictive of the natural flow of Dry Creek.
